LETHAL WEAPON 4 GOES OFF



Lethal Weapon 4 – 46 Iron Men - 19

Keenan McCardell scored three touchdowns—two on receptions, one on a fumble return, two of them, more than 50 yards—to lead Lethal Weapon 4 to the week's high score in the UFFL and a 46-19 demolition of Iron Men. John Hall contributed four field goals

(including a +50 yarder) and 16 points to the effort as well.

Ted Chappell, LW4's owner, was quite impressed with McCardell's efforts, saying afterwards in a celebratory e-mail, "Who needs RBs?" LW4 certainly didn't. Neither of their RB's scored. It hardly mattered, though. It was almost as if God wanted to prove that WR's are important too.

In Other Action...

Egomaniacs 21 - Chunky Soup 17
